He made tapestries.




Vocabulary	
Spelling	Definition
Shading	The darkening or colouring of an illustration or diagram with parallel lines or a block of colour
Tone	The quality of brightness, deepness, or hue of a shade of a colour
Texture	The quality of the surface of a work of art.
Hatching	The shading with closely drawn parallel lines.
Cross hatching	The shade with intersecting sets of parallel lines

Skills and techniques

- Reflect, analyse and critical evaluate the work of others
- Take inspiration from artwork by William Morris
- Make precise repeated patterns
- Sketch lightly (no need to use a rubber to correct mistakes).
- Use shading to show light and shadow.
- Sketch using different harnesses of pencils to show line, tone and texture
- Replicate some techniques used by William Morris
- Create original pieces that are influenced by studies of others.
- Use hatching and cross hatching to show tone and texture.







Agreed outcome: Why
